Please note:

- Total payments detailed above include expenditure that is not directly related to the specific schemes you have asked for information about, for example, the Home Office pays a yearly membership fee to the IOM as a member state.
- A number of our payments were made in US Dollars, Euros and Swiss Francs and have therefore been subject to significant currency fluctuations over the five year period.
- Total payments to IOM include funding received by UKBA for allocation to IOM from the EU Return Fund. Although made by UKBA on behalf of the EU Return Fund these payments are not made from the UKBA budget.
- Damien Green MP has initiated an investigation into the UKBA spend with the IOM in order to understand the discrepancy between the total spend with the IOM and the spend provided for the schemes listed below.

2.1 Assisted Voluntary Return (AVR) Programmes

Assisted Voluntary Return (AVR) programmes are available to assist those in the UK asylum system and those who are in the UK illegally who wish to return voluntarily and permanently to their country of origin (or, where admissible, to a third country).

There are two main AVR programmes:

- Voluntary Assisted Return and Reintegration Programme (VARRP) is for those who have sought asylum and those with certain forms of temporary status in the UK
- Assisted Voluntary Return for Irregular Migrants (AVRIM) is for those migrants who have not sought asylum, but who are in the UK illegally and wish to return home

Previously two other programmes were operated which were country specific to help support the development and re-construction of Afghanistan. They were:

- The Return to Afghanistan Programme (RAP). RAP commenced in August 2002 and closed on 31 March 2008. In addition to assistance with flights and internal travel, and advice on re-integration and the availability of services (as with VARRP) RAP offered small resettlement grants as an incentive to return.
- The Explore and Prepare for Return to Afghanistan (E&P). E&P was launched in October 2003 and closed on 31 March 2008. E&P allowed some Afghans who had permanent status in the UK to return to Afghanistan to explore the option of making a permanent return. Afghans who had status in the UK could return home for up to one year, depending on their leave entitlement, without their immigration status in the UK being affected.

UKBA also chartered 44 flights to Northern Iraq from August 2005 to December 2006 for Iraqi nationals who had applied to the VARRP scheme to return to Northern Iraq.

When considering voluntary returns it should be borne in mind that the National Audit Office report published in January 2009 titled 'Management of Asylum Applications by the UK Border Agency' stated that voluntary return under VARRP costs £100-£3,400 less than an enforced removal in the case of a single adult, and £1,400-£14,600 less in the case of a family. 3.1 IAMA Interfaith Project

This pilot project provided multi-faith training to foreign-born religious leaders who, due to their specific cultural backgrounds and/or undeveloped language skills are unprepared for living and working in a multicultural, multi-faith environment. The project started in August 2007 and concluded in August 2008. Approximately 20 participants received the multi faith training in the UK. The Home Office contributed €20,000 to this project.

3.2 The Gateway Protection Programme

In partnership with the UNHCR, the UK Border Agency manages the UK's resettlement scheme, the Gateway Protection Programme.

3.3 Global Calais Project

In 2006 UKBA funded a project, run by IOM, called Calais Information Campaign. The main aim was to distribute information on Assisted Voluntary Return options to migrants in Calais, Northern France.

In 2008 the project evolved into the **Global Calais Project**, with the following aims:

- Build on successes of information campaign
- Embed a sustainable number of returns from Calais
- Develop strategies for working upstream tackle migratory flows both at source and at transit points

3.4 Iraqi Staff 'Direct Entry' scheme

The objective of the scheme is to offer Indefinite Leave to Enter the UK as a concession outside the rules, to staff and their dependants who have been employed in Iraq by UK armed forces and civilian missions for at least 12 months from 8th August 2007 provided they met specific entry criteria. Those who availed themselves of this scheme were assisted and escorted to the UK by IOM escorts. The UKBA has only funded the scheme from 2009/10, the value of which was £454,000. This figure is to be recovered from employing departments (MOD/ FCO). To date, 112 principal applicants and their dependents have been resettled in the UK amounting to 234 individuals.

3.5 Projects focused on capacity building in third countries

The UKBA has funded a number of IOM projects in third countries that are aimed at building capacity to deal with irregular migration flows. Due to the nature of these projects and the way that many are managed from foreign posts the UKBA does not hold all of the information requested. The information that is held is shown below:

3.6 The Facilitated Return Scheme

The Facilitated Return Scheme, which was introduced on 12 October 2006, offers non European Economic Area foreign national offenders the opportunity to volunteer to return to their home country. This option saves the United Kingdom taxpayer the cost of detaining the foreign national beyond their custodial sentence and the costs associated with pursuing deportation through the courts. Foreign national offenders removed under this scheme are not allowed to return to the United Kingdom except in the most exceptional circumstances.
