In the most recent attempt by a Member State to re-introduce internal border checks, today's decision of the Danish government has been strongly denounced by the ALDE group in the European Parliament.

"We note with great regret that today the Danish government has decided to reintroduce customs and border controls at the German and Swedish borders. Threats
to public order or national security will not be effectively met by purely national border
measures but must be based on an EU approach that focuses on strengthening the
external borders and European co-operation, while maintaining all the benefits of free
movement within the Schengen area." said ALDE President Guy VerhofstadtALDE
will demand that the European Commission immediately take action to assess
whether the Danish measures are in line with the letter and spirit of EU law governing
free movement. In the view of the Liberal group in the European Parliament the EU
cannot and must not accept any attempt to roll back the EU Treaty, either for free

movement of goods or persons at internal borders.

"Even if the Danish measures from a legal point were to be found within the Treaty provisions, they go completely against its spirit, thus undermining one of the greatest EU achievements. And they certainly are contrary to the Liberal vision of a borderless Europe and marks a very worrying threat to the essence of EU integration". added Renate Weber (PNL, Romania) ALDE coordinator in the Civil liberties Committee.
