Subject:	IMS action list III - drawing up of a manual on information exchange

1. Introduction

The main suggestion of document 13681/08 ENFOPOL 175 SCH-EVAL 75
CRIMORG 152 SIRIS 138 COMIX 706 on a handbook concerning cross-border police cooperation was to set up two complementary manuals, one on cross-border cooperation (see doc. 10505/4/09 REV4 ENFOPOL 157 ENFOCUSTOM 55 CRIMORG 90 COMIX 465) and another on information exchange. In order to launch the drafting of the latter manual, the annex to document 11789/10 JAI 599 DAPIX 1 set out a suggestion for the structure of both the information exchange manual and the national fact sheet to be included in that manual. The document has been submitted to DAPIX on 7 July 2010 but the matter has not resumed since then.

2. Content of the manual

The manual would be structured firstly according to subjects and not per instrument. Consequently, legal texts are mentioned according to the purpose they are relevant for and may appear several times in the manual. The handbook does not repeat existing legal texts but sets out references to steer users to existing documents for details.

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Finally, an addendum to the manual would consists of a national fact sheet per Member State, containing practical information on contact points relevant for the cross-border exchange of information.

3. Purpose

The objective is to give an overview of the different legal possibilities for exchanging information and related practical aspects. It will obviously focus on Council Framework Decision 2006/960/JHA ("Swedish Framework Decision") and Council Decision 2008/615/JHA ("Prüm Decision"), but not be limited to these instruments. It should be user-friendly and complete, keeping in mind law enforcement officers in the field as the target group.

By filling in the national fact sheets to be amended to the manual, Member States would comply with the many notification obligations under the different instruments. Existing lists would be used to start the completion of these fact sheets. This should allow for an easier management and retrieval of this information.

4. Way forward

The drafting should be done with a limited group of experts. Draft versions prepared by this group could be circulated to all delegations, both for their information and for eliciting comments. Once the draft manual would be ready, it would be submitted to DAPIX for thorough examination and subsequent approval.

With regard to actions to be carried out in the framework of IMS, Member States called upon themselves to set up guidelines/best practices in order to enhance the use of existing information exchange solutions. Accordingly, the Presidency submits this proposal to the DAPIX meeting of 21 September. Delegations are invited to consider the suggested project as part of IMS action list No 3.

Terms of reference: The Police Cooperation Working Party in its meeting of 20 January 2008 welcomed the proposal to draft an overall Police Cooperation Handbook, which would be a one-stop-shop for all information concerning cross-border police cooperation and would thereby respond to a practical need of the officers in the field. It was proposed to draw up two complementary manuals, i.e. on the one hand, a <u>manual on cross-border operations</u> and, on the other hand a <u>manual on information exchange</u>, which would include the Guidelines for the implementation of the Swedish Framework Decision, the relevant parts of the old Schengen manual on police cooperation and information on the "Prüm Decisions".
