Delegations will find enclosed the UNICEF Libya key advocacy messages on missing migrants exposed during the meeting of the EMWP held on 14 March 2024, Item 2 on agenda CM 1711/1/24 REV 1



UNICEF Libya key advocacy messages on missing migrants:

- Libya has ratified the Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) Joint General Comment 4 of 2017 states <u>no detention for migrant children irrespective</u> of illegality of entry or of their parents' status.
- The European Union to invest in and advocate for a strengthened Child Protection system, namely:
- 1. Training of Libya Border Guards and financing / deployment of permanent Child Protection Teams at border and disembarkation points.
- 2. Advocate to establish an inter-country record of missing children and Family Tracing registry under Social Affairs (starting between Libya and Tunisia).
- Invest and advocate with MOI and PM Office on allowing children in detention to be hosted in Social Affairs/UN supported foster /interim care while Best Interest Determination and Durable Solutions (repatriation, resettlement, foster) are worked on.
- Advocate with Embassies of origin to ensure birth registration of all migrant/refugee children as well as subsequent access to essential services (e.g. immunization/primary health; schooling).
