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Legislative work and other legal acts

Amending Regulation 2018/1806 as regards holders of Serbian passports issued by the Serbian Coordination Directorate

- Mandate of negotiation approved by Coreper on 14
 February 2024
- Report of the rapporteur adopted in LIBE committee on 9
 April 2024
- Confirmation of the political agreement by Coreper on 10 April
- Plenary vote in EP on 23 April

FOLLOW-UP: "corrigendum" procedure and final adoption by the EP and the Council in the fall 2024



2. Amending Regulation 2018/1806 as regards the visa suspension mechanism

- Mandate of negotiation approved by Coreper on 13 March 2024
- On EP side, rapporteur (Matjaž Nemec S&D) decided to postpone the vote on the report in LIBE committee

FOLLOW-UP: EP to adopt its position + trilogues to start under incoming Presidencies



3. Amending Regulation 2018/1806 as regards Vanuatu

- Publication of the Commission proposal on 31 May 2024
- Mandate of negotiation approved by Coreper on 19 June
 2024

FOLLOW-UP : EP to adopt its position + trilogues to start under HU Presidency



- 4. Council implementation decision on repealing Implementing Decision (EU) 2022/2459 on the application of an increased visa fee with respect to The Gambia
 - Approval in Coreper on 10 Avril 2024
 - Formal adoption in Council (Ecofin) on 12 April 2024
 - Entry into force: 29 April 2024

FOLLOW-UP : COM to monitor evolution of the cooperation on readmission



- 5. Council implementation decision on the suspension of certain provisions of Regulation (EC) 810/2009 of the European Parliament and of the Council with respect to Ethiopia
 - Approval in Coreper on 17 Avril 2024
 - Formal adoption in Council (Agrifish) on 29 April 2024
 - Entry into force: 1 June 2024

FOLLOW-UP: COM to monitor evolution of the cooperation on readmission

- New report on Art. 25a mechanism: June 2024
- IRAQ: new state of play in October



O2 Strategic discussions

1. Future of visa policy

- Objectives: tackle abuse of visa policy (link between visa and asylum policies) + strategic use of visa policy in our relations with third countries
- Discussions at technical, strategic and political level (Visa WP 26/03 & 24/04, Informal SCIFA 15/05, Schengen Council 13/06)



- Main takeaways of the discussion during
 Schengen Council on 13 June
 - ✓ Need to develop comprehensive statistics on visa abuse = priority for next institutional cycle
 - ✓ Willingness to address more decisively the issue of non-alignment of third countries visa policies

FOLLOW-UP: next COM to reflect on the development of a common EU strategy on visa policy, incoming presidencies to pursue strategic discussions on visa policy

- 2. New approach of the report of the COM under the visa suspension mechanism
- Objective: foster greater synergy between
 Council and Commission, notably by foreseeing
 regular follow-up discussions (at least 1 per
 semester) + determine list of priority countries

FOLLOW-UP: incoming presidencies to pursue the new approach, COM invited to take into account Member States' input for the report (new report expected fall 2024)

- 3. New approach of the BE PDCY regarding Article 25a mechanism
- Objective: rationalize the discussions in the Council + focus on visa-related aspects in the Visa WP

FOLLOW-UP: incoming presidencies to pursue the new approach, further adapt if needed



4. Towards a second generation of VFAs

 Objective: evaluate the relevance of creating a new generation of VFA to continue to benefit from VFAs that best serve the UE interests

FOLLOW-UP: COM invited to take into account the orientations that emerged from the exchange of views (Visa WP 21/05) when drafting and negotiating upcoming VFAs



03 Other

 Kazakhstan: political agreement to move forward with the negotiation of a VFA (and EURA)

FOLLOW-UP: COM to come back on this in the fall

Armenia: opening of a visa liberalisation dialogue

FOLLOW-UP: waiting for the updated report from COM – file on hold at the moment

- Evaluation of the Visa Code
- Letter to EP regarding delegated act raising visa fees
- Letter to US regarding aircrew visa requirement

FOLLOW-UP : outreach to be continued by COM and incoming presidencies
