

Weekly information received concerning:

- Refusals of entry
- Asylum applications
- Illegal stay/over-stayers
- Facilitators and traffickers
- Minors
- Forged and counterfeit documents
- All route approach/flights for every above case





(AB-RAN)/ Pulsar Data - What it does

Provides the EU and Frontex with:

- Enhanced Situational Awareness
- Support for the prompt identification of emerging trends and threats
- Contribution to the initiation/prioritisation of operational activities and response
